- 5. Election of Officers: President, Secretary, Treasurer
 - a. Dawson nominated Pahl for president; unanimous approval.
 - b. Walker nominated Lundt for Secretary; unanimous approval.
 - c. Strey-Hirt nominated Dawson for Treasurer; unanimous approval.
- 6. Review Year's Activities
 - a. Chair's Report: "State of the Lake District"—Pahl see print out
 - b. Weed Cutting and Fishery—Radtke Weeds are slowly returning, but still a lot less than before the lake was drained. 2023 = 9 loads so far. 2022 = 8.25 Loads Most loads = 429 in a season.
 - c. City Partnership (Lights)—Braden Pole is up and 1 light working. 2nd light is backordered and will be installed when it is delivered.
 - d. County Partnership—Strey-Hirt Still trying to get Sen Cole to plan a visit. Researching different educational opportunities for us too.
 - e. Kayak Race and Duck Race Need quality (vs quantity) prizes this year. Pahl will have the raffle tickets soon, so plan on going to businesses, etc. to get them sold!
 - f. Planting Party at 7Maples—Dawson Was a very well organized project. Dawson wanted to have a special thanks to Tom Lederer for bringing his garden tractor to lead the march down the road to 7 Maples! He also watered the new plants during the extreme heat to ensure success!!! Another special thank you to the Lundt family for bringing the trailers and man, woman and children power. Many hands made light work of this awesome project.
 - g. Cops n Bobbers Many more participants this year compared to the previous year. Catch-rates were up a little as well, but overall fishing was a struggle, but fun was

- abundant. There was an overwhelming agreement that this is a really good thing for the kids, networking with different groups and just being part of a fun, positive event.
- h. Ruff Fish Tournament Results improved from the first tournament. Over 12 fish registered 27" or more!!!! 16 Koi-Carp (which is concerning to have them so abundant). Total of 526 ruff fish registered, plus there were a few bullheads, sunfish and perch that were released during the tournament. Overall, another great event.
- i. Water Quality Testing Dawson We continue to test the clarity of the water. Because of our consistent, persistent efforts, the DNR is more likely to continue working with us/allowing us to be more involved, etc. Overall water clarity is poor assuming from lake of weeds/ruff fish stirring up the water.
